# Rockwell Collins *FIRST* LEGO League New Team Grants Available

### Application Deadline: September 15, 2012

Dear Educator:

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The *FIRST*<sup>®</sup> LEGO<sup>®</sup> League (FLL<sup>®</sup>) program is designed to interest children of ages 9-14 in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). We do this by combining a fun and exciting robotics competition with an interesting and challenging scientific research project and presentation. We also have a Junior FLL program for children of ages 6-9. Additional information about the volunteer-run FLL program is available online at <u>http://FLL.LARobotics.org</u>.

The FLL program is entering its fourteenth year. Last year, we had 19,800 FLL teams participating in over 50 countries. This year, we expect about 300 FLL teams with 2,400 students in the Los Angeles Region. We would like to invite the students at your school join the fun by starting an FLL team.

Each year, the Los Angeles Region FLL receives a \$30,000 grant from Rockwell Collins to sponsor the region's championship tournament and to help start new FLL teams in economically and/or socially disadvantaged schools or communities in the Los Angeles Region. For eligible new teams, the grant covers the costs of team registration and a robot set (\$747) plus a coach stipend of \$500. Second year support covers the cost of registration (\$260). Most LAUSD schools are eligible to receive these grants. Last year, seventeen (17) teams received New Team Support and ten (10) coaches received stipends. An additional thirteen (13) teams received Second Year Team Support and three (3) coaches received stipends. Stipends for second year teams will be discontinued after this year.

Grant applications will be reviewed and approved weekly beginning in May. Grant applications are due by September 15, 2012. In order to help you start a new team at your school, an experienced FLL coach and/or FLL team can come to your school to give a demo and/or meet with you and/or your students to answer any questions that you or they may have. Training sessions for new coaches and mentors are available either in person, by teleconference, or online by recorded teleconference. We also hold FLL Challenge Release workshops the first weekend of September in Camarillo, Glendale, Lancaster, Los Alamos and Manhattan Beach.

I have attached a brief overview of the 2012 FLL program. Please forward this information to any teachers that might be interested in coaching an FLL team as an after school activity at your school. Please contact me if you have any questions.
